Changes to program offerings that the LEA has made in response to school closures to address the COVID-19 emergency and the major impacts of the closures on students and families.

The school is committed to ensuring a continuation and continuum of learning in line with regular expectations in a site-based program. This means that we follow the regular content for each subject, aligned with common core state standards. Where it has been necessary to distribute print materials (textbooks, workbooks) we have achieved this by having staged pick up times. Chromebooks have been offered to any family that requests one to use at home. All delivery of content is conducted virtually using online platforms including video conferencing, google drive, etc. We have a policy that every student is accounted for and is expected to be engaged in learning. We have differentiated expectations where families demonstrate need, that is, for students encountering difficulties we permit 'credit/no credit.' We work in tandem with the Special Education department to ensure students are receiving accommodations.

Teachers meet weekly to discuss progress and strategies to ensure the needs of all students are met. There is an agreement in place that all teachers will reach out to families individually to ensure that they are able to access curriculum content and materials in line with expectations for all learners. Access to education is ensured by offering students and families the resources to be able to complete assignments, whether it is a chromebook or alternative materials. Instruction is offered on a one-to-one basis if required.

The school has migrated all teaching and learning to either google classroom, canvas, or both. Most teachers uses zoom for face to face instruction, several use a youtube channel or flipgrid. A schedule of activities for virtual learning has been developed and shared by each teacher, assignments are issued regularly and can be turned in online or dropped off.
